- 3. What do you mean by General exceptions to offences? How far is insanity a defence in an offence? On whom does the burden of proving insanity lies? Refer to case law on this point.

 - a) Husband and wife conspired to prison.
 - b) A natural person and the company (which is also a person) conspire to destroy official document.
- 8. Distinguish (any two): (8x2)

 - b) Wrongful restrain and wrongful confinement.
 - c) Affray and Assault.
 - d) Theft and Extortion.
- 9. When can unsoundness of mind be pleaded as a defence under the Indian Penal Code. Refer to decided cases.
- 10. Under what circumstances an act done in good faith for the benefit of a person without consent does not constitute an offence? Is there any exception to this rule under Indian penal code? Discuss with illustration.
